

Consent to the publication of individual-related data and photographs of students

Dear parents, legal guardians and students,
where fitting we would like to allow a broader public access to information on and documentation of events at our school – sometimes also concerning individual persons. We therefore intend to publish texts and photographs which provide insight into, in particular, our work as educators or school events. This applies not only to class photographs but also – where the case may be – to individual-related information about school trips, exchanges, competitions, sports events, projects and open days.

The concession of rights excludes payment and includes the right to process and edit, as long as this does not deface. An alphabetical list of names is attached to class photos in the yearbook / yearly report, otherwise no names are attached to photographs. Your consent does not apply to video, film and sound recordings.

You are entitled to revoke your consent at any time – please give this in writing to the Principal. As regards print media, consent may not be revoked after the text or photograph in question has gone into print.

If consent is not revoked it remains valid until the student leaves school.

Consent is voluntary. No disadvantages arise from refusing to or revoking consent.
